


40 million

The prevalence is highest in Asia and the Pacific

62% of victims for forced labour are found in the Asia-Pacific region



25 million people are in situations of forced labour More than 16 million are in the private sector 50% are affected by debt bondage



One in four of the victims of forced labour are international migrant workers Migrant workers are at greater risk of abuse due to the COVID-19 pandemic
