Organizations interested in showcasing **informational tools, resources, or materials** are invited to submit a request for space allocation in the Forum's **Exhibition Booth Area**, subject to availability.

Please note that space is limited, and allocations will be made on a **first-come, first-served basis**, subject to meeting the requirements outlined below.

When requesting space, please provide a short description of:

- the topic you wish to present; and
- the type of informational material you would like to display.

### Requirements

- All information and materials presented by participants must be relevant to the agenda of preventing and addressing modern slavery and aligned with the Forum's principles of constructive and respectful dialogue.
- The requesting organization is responsible for managing its assigned table/stand throughout the Forum.
- Distribution of materials outside the assigned Exhibition Booth Area is not permitted.
- Materials containing offensive language or imagery will not be allowed.
- Use of the stand for promoting commercial services, advertising, or selling materials is not permitted. The space is for informational purposes only.
- Decoration of the stand (e.g., banners or distinctive elements) is optional and is the responsibility of each organization.
- Please note that power supply for electronic equipment may be limited or unavailable.
- It is not necessary to remain at the stand at all times. Materials may be left unattended during sessions, under the responsibility of each organization.
